Huw Richards on a RL legend from Doncaster

In 70 years in the RFL, Doncaster have understandably drawn much more on the heartlands of the West Riding than their own district. And perhaps the most distinguished league player from Doncaster, Rossingtonborn Ted Slevin, lived there only for the first 18 months of his life.

One of the stalwart forwards of the 1950s, Slevin undoubtedly benefited from that childhood move to Wigan. It was with the Cherry and Whites that he took massive early steps towards his greatest single distinction, as one of only five players – and the first Englishman following the Welshmen Aubrey Casewell and Alan Edwards – to win all six trophies possible, the Championship, Challenge Cup and the Yorkshire and Lancashire League and Cup, in the 'Four Cup' era.

That his achievement reflected collective as much as individual accomplishment was in keeping with being, as Huddersfield chairman William Cunningham wrote in his 1961 testimonial brochure, 'the perfect team man'.

He appears in contemporary accounts as a selfless forward grafter and unpretentious enabler of others in an age when contested scrums made matches a real grind. He scored only six tries in 396 appearances for the Fartowners up the end of the 1960-1 season, but as the club's Rugby Leaguer correspondent wrote 'When Huddersfield scored a try from a play-the-ball or from loose play, Ted Slevin invariably had a hand in it'.

That six-trophy feat was completed early in his career. He made his debut for Wigan in January 1949 and had won all four Cups with them by the end of the 1950-1 season, most notably the Championship claimed in 1950 by defeating Huddersfield with a team lacking eight players who had already departed for the tour of Australia.

Huddersfield doubtless remembered that final when they signed him in October 1951. He won the Yorkshire League that season, followed by the Yorkshire and Challenge Cups in 1952-3, their best season since the dominant era either side of the First World War. He continued to work in Wigan, initially as a miner and from 1959 in a canning factory. With the M62 still long in the future this meant five hour return treks to training and home matches, but he became a constant feature of Huddersfield teams over the next decade. Few clubs have fielded more league giants, making his selection for the Huddersfield Hall of Fame not long after his death in 1998 testament to a fine career.

As Wigan legend Joe Egan recalled "The mystery to me is how he was ever allowed to leave Central Park". He had been a regular at prop or second row in two hugely successful seasons.

Another mystery is a truncated international career – two games for England and two Great Britain v France matches which were denied full test status. As a prop he had to compete with two undoubted giants – Ken Gee and Alan Prescott. But AN Gaulton, compiler of the testimonial brochure, noted a further reason. Yorkshireborn and Lancashire-raised might have struck Gaulton as 'a good combination', but for Slevin proved something of a Catch-22.

The county championship was an important rung on the ladder. Slevin played as a novice for Lancashire in 1949. Called up for Yorkshire after joining Huddersfield, he fell victim to a recent rule change preventing players from playing for more than one county.

Yorkshire may have been unable to claim him, but Doncaster can and should regard him with pride.

Skolars 25 years ago

With the winter season having finished at the start of the month, the summer season came with a two week break.

Skolars were due to play in the first round of games in the new Southern Conference, playing as North London Skolars. However, with Kingston dropping out they would have to wait another week before they made their debut. Elsewhere in the Southern Conference, there were wins for Worcester Royals, Cambridge Eagles and West London Sharks.

Head Coach Richard Horne is in his sixth season in charge at the club, having moved partway through 2017 from Hull where he was assistant coach. He played his entire club career for Hull, as well as 12 appearances for Great Britain. He played in the 2005 Challenge Cup winning side (that final being played in Cardiff whilst Wembley was being rebuilt). He's assembled an experience squad with a number of internationals as the Dons seek to improve on their fourth place in 2019.

Centre Jason Tali played for Papua New Guinea in the 2013 World Cup before joining Newcastle Thunder in 2015, moving to Doncaster two years late. He scored a hat-trick against Skolars in a drawn game five years, a result that led to the vacancy that Horne was to fill.

Fellow Papua New Guinean Watson Boas made his debut for his country against Fiji in 2016 scoring two tries. The scrum half was then playing for PNG Hunters in the Queensland Cup, moving to the UK to play for Featherstone Rovers in 2019. He played for Doncaster on Ioan that season, joining permanently the following year.

Centre/winger Misi Taulapapa played for Samoa in the 2008 World Cup. He was playing for Cronulla Sharks in the NRL at the time. The 39 year old joined Sheffield Eagles in 2010 spending six seasons there before spells at Featherstone Rovers and Newcastle Thunder, joining the Dons this season. Whilst the name Poching will be familiar, half-back/hooker Kobe Poching is a youngster who recently joined Doncaster on loan from Wakefield Trinity, where his father Willie is coach.

Aaron Ollett and Ross Whitmore both played 20 games for the Dons last season. 29 year old Ollett came through Hull KR's junior ranks, making his debut for them in 2014 after a loan spell with Gateshead Thunder. The loose forward then had spells at Keighley, Dewsbury and Newcastle before joining Doncaster last season. 20 year old Whitmore made his debur last season as well, though the forward had a very different route to Ollett, having moved from RU side Yorkshire Carnegie.

Head to Head

Last season's encounter at New River was the Friday Night Lights game. Doncaster took an early lead with Ben Johnson making a break from 20 metres out with Sam Smeaton in support to finish the move. Skolars levelled the scores with a similar move, this time Neil Thorman backing up to touchdown after Jacob Thomas edged past the defence. Thomas then set up Aaron Small to score and with Neil Thorman kicking a penalty after the hooter, Skolars led 12-6 at half-time.

Skolars extended the lead with another Thorman penalty. Doncaster narrowed the gap when Matty Beharrell floated a long pass out to the left for Sam Doherty. Beharrell's conversion hit the posts; a miss that turned out to be important. He converted Ben How's try to put his side in the lead.

Ben Howe he went for a high ball in attack. The full-back joined the attacking line on the right to touchdown in the resulting set. This time Beharrell's kick was successful putting the Dons into the lead for the first time in the match. Another Thorman penalty levelled it at 16 all, but then the Dons had two drop-goal chances before the hooter sounded.

When the cap doesn't fit

David Ballheimer on the failures of the salary cap



OK, I admit it, I am biased and my teams play in a very small rugby league market, so opponents of my opinion use it to dispute my assertions. Put simply, the salary cap needs to be reined in and strictly enforced throughout the professional game.

The original salary cap in Super League was enforced quite stringently with a number of clubs falling foul of the limit and suffering fines and, on a few occasions, points deductions. It could be said that Wigan Warriors got off very lightly as they were repeat offenders, the second transgression coming when they broke their cap limit to sign two quality players who helped the club avoid relegation.

When one looks at the punishment the NRL inflicted on Melbourne Storm (or English Rugby Union on Premiership powerhouse Saracens), relegation would have been a reasonable penalty. Of course, this is rugby league and Wigan are, well, Wigan; join the dots. These Super League clubs had the resources to overcome the fines and didn't break the cap for years after this.

Salary caps were instituted in lower divisions too, but they were loosened at the request of clubs desperate to taste the honey of a higher level. It started in the early 2010s when Leigh Centurions persuaded the RFL to expand the salary cap in the Championship, and grew when Toronto joined League 1. The Wolfpack wage bill was greater than most teams in the division above them but, sadly, it didn't

end well for them; actually, spectacularly badly was something of an understatement.

Toronto's arrival in 2017 saw the salary caps in League One and the Championship revised to accommodate them. The Wolfpack blasted through League 1, blew the Million Pound Game in their second season and won it in year three. Then came Covid and the harsh reality of serious financial scrutiny. Forced to stay in England, visa issues resulted in players returning to the southern hemisphere, and most others not being paid. After half a dozen losses in Super League they disappeared, owing tens of thousands of pounds to numerous players.

Other clubs in lower divisions went to the very limit of the expanded salary cap and suddenly found they had overspent. One club went into administration less than a month of winning promotion to the Championship, not their first financial meltdown of the summer rugby era. Another club, currently in the Championship, has suffered multiple insolvencies yet still seem able to sign high-profile, normally high-earning, players despite these financial woes.

There is a strong argument that a sport's governing body should not have to force their clubs to behave with fiscal responsibility, but history shows that they do. Sadly, greed conquers all, and the lust for glory and success blinds clubs to the harsh realities of financial security.

Skolars 20 years ago - The Rugby League Conference (which had developed from the Southern Conference that had started 5 years before) kicked off with two games against sides that had become big rivals. They travelled to West London Sharks with two long range tries for Charlie Oyebade putting his side ahead. They sealed the game when Trevor O'Loughlin intercepted 5 metres from his own try line, slipping the ball out to Jake Johnstone who raced 90 metres to score, Skolars running out 10-38 winners. They then put in a commanding display at home to Crawley Jets winning 48-10




